The International Committee was established at the 1<sup>st</sup> European congress of deportees and refugees, victims of Fascism and Nazism, which was held on June 6, 2009, in Ljubljana, Slovenia, and attended by over 4000 people.

The International Committee has established rules for its operations and meets in a different member country each year.
